

## **1. Our God of Justice and Love**

**Psalm 89:14–15 (July 5)**

### **Opening Prayer**

**Lord, thank You for accepting us just as we are. Through worship, help us know Your love and joyfully obey the Word You have given us in love.**

### **Praise**

**(Worship Song) *Praise the Name of Jesus***

### **Scripture Reading**

**Let us read Psalm 89:14–15 together.**

### **Message Summary**

**God reigns with justice and leads us with steadfast love. His rule is built on righteousness and justice, and love and truth go before Him. Those who know God live in the light of His presence and praise Him with joy. Life in God is full of blessing.**

### **Sharing Questions**

- What words does the psalmist use to describe God's throne? What does each mean? (v.14)**
- Have you ever experienced God's justice, love, or truth in your life? Share your story.**

### **Thanksgiving Prayer**

**We praise You, Lord, who governs the world with justice, love, and truth. Help us hate evil by imitating Your justice and show mercy by imitating Your love. May we live in the blessing of Your shining face.**

### **Closing Praise**

**(Hymn 393) *Great Is Thy Faithfulness***

**We conclude our family worship with the Lord's Prayer.**

## **2. An Example of Grace-Saved Life**

**1 Timothy 1:12–16 (July 9)**

### **Opening Prayer**

**Lord, thank You for giving us faith and adopting us as Your children. Help us always remember Your grace and worship You with gratitude.**

### **Praise**

**(Worship Song) *I'm So Ashamed of My Old Self***

### **Scripture Reading**

**Let us read 1 Timothy 1:12–16 together.**

### **Message Summary**

**Paul shares how amazing God's grace is by pointing to his own life. He had once persecuted Christians and called himself the worst sinner. Yet Jesus waited patiently, saved him, and made him an apostle. God is merciful and saves even the worst sinner.**

### **Sharing Questions**

- What kind of person was Paul before meeting Jesus? (v.13)**
- Why did Jesus show him patience? (v.16)**
- As someone saved by grace, how do you want others to see Jesus through you?**

### **Thanksgiving Prayer**

**Lord, thank You for patiently waiting for us and saving us despite our weakness and failures. As You changed us with love, help us approach others with patience and love and lead them to eternal life.**

### **Closing Praise**

**(Hymn 289) *Into My Heart, Lord Jesus***

**We conclude our family worship with the Lord's Prayer.**

### **3. Train Yourself in Godliness Every Day**

**1 Timothy 4:7–8 (July 13)**

#### **Opening Prayer**

**Lord, we have gathered to worship. Help us put aside worldly thoughts and understand Your will through the Word.**

#### **Praise**

**(Worship Song) *Receive My Heart, O Lord***

#### **Scripture Reading**

**Let us read 1 Timothy 4:7–8 together.**

#### **Message Summary**

**Paul wanted Timothy to be faithful in ministry. He encouraged him to avoid meaningless talk and train himself for godliness. While physical training has value, spiritual training is even more beneficial and brings the promise of eternal life.**

#### **Sharing Questions**

- Why did Paul tell Timothy to train himself for godliness? (vv.7–8)**
- Share one daily habit that helps your spiritual health, and pray together to commit to it.**

#### **Thanksgiving Prayer**

**Thank You, Lord, for showing us the value of godliness. Help us distance ourselves from distractions and grow closer to You daily. Let us build each other up and enjoy the blessings You have promised.**

#### **Closing Praise**

**(Hymn 420) *Take Time to Be Holy***

**We conclude our family worship with the Lord's Prayer.**

## **4. We Are Watchmen Who Share the Gospel**

**Ezekiel 3:17–19 (July 22)**

### **Opening Prayer**

**Lord, thank You for choosing, calling, and guiding us in Your love. Help us center our lives on You and walk faithfully in Your path.**

### **Praise**

**(Worship Song) *The Lord Guides My Way***

### **Scripture Reading**

**Let us read Ezekiel 3:17–19 together.**

### **Message Summary**

**God appointed Ezekiel as a watchman for Israel. A watchman protects the community by warning of danger. If he gives the warning and people don't repent, he is not at fault. But if he stays silent, he bears responsibility. Like Ezekiel, we are called to share the gospel and lead others to salvation.**

### **Sharing Questions**

- What did God tell Ezekiel to do as a watchman? (v.17)**
- Who is someone you need to share the gospel with? How can you approach them?**

### **Thanksgiving Prayer**

**Thank You, Lord, for letting us hear the gospel and receive forgiveness and salvation. Many around us still don't believe in Jesus. Help us carry Your heart and faithfully share the good news.**

### **Closing Praise**

**(Hymn 505) *From All the World***

**We conclude our family worship with the Lord's Prayer.**
