

August 2 – Ezekiel 11:19–20

01 Renew Our Hearts

Opening Prayer

God, thank You for loving us despite our shortcomings. Through this worship, help us obey Your Word given in love and become more like You.

Praise

Scripture Reading

Read Ezekiel 11:19–20 together.

Reflection

God disciplines sin but also offers grace for restoration. He promised to change the hearts of His exiled people and make them His own again. To restore our relationship with God, our hearts must be transformed. When a heart of stone becomes soft like flesh, we become people who obey.

Discussion

1. How does God transform a heart of stone? Why does He want to change our hearts?
2. When your heart is hardened by your own thoughts and stubbornness, how should you pray to receive the soft heart given by the Holy Spirit?

Share what you're thankful for.

Closing Prayer

God, thank You for Your loving patience and for giving us another chance. Help us cast away our stubborn hearts that block Your grace and blessings. Fill us daily with the abundant grace of the Holy Spirit so we may have soft hearts that obey Your Word.

 August 7 – Ezekiel 14:6–8

02 Let Go of Idols and Hold On to God

Opening Prayer

God, thank You for faithfully caring for us. Help us learn Your law through Your Word and live according to Your will.

Scripture Reading

Read Ezekiel 14:6–8 together.

Reflection

Idolatry is a sin that God strictly forbids, as emphasized in the first and second commandments. It leads us away from holiness and into sin. Even in exile, Israel’s leaders clung to idols. Those who seek God without abandoning idols face His fearful judgment.

Discussion

1. What sin did God point out in the elders of Israel?
2. Anything you rely on or serve more than God is an idol. What idols do you need to let go of?

Thanksgiving

Share what you’re thankful for.

Closing Prayer

God, we confess that money, appearance, and fame have been our idols. Forgive us for having divided hearts driven by greed. Help us welcome You as the Lord of our hearts, walk in Your ways, and become faithful workers for Your kingdom.

03 God Who Raises and Lowers

 **Opening Prayer**

 **Reflection**

 **Discussion**

1. What happens when God plants a tender branch from the top of a cedar on Israel’s high mountain? What does this symbolize?
2. Share one request you want to bring before the God who raises and lowers.

 **Closing Prayer**

God, help us rely not on worldly power but on You, the sovereign Lord of all. We hope for complete restoration through King Jesus and live with firm faith in Your Word.

Opening Prayer

Reflection

Discussion

1. What is the only way for a wicked person to live, according to God?

05 The One Person God Seeks

Opening Prayer

Reflection

Discussion

1. Before judging Jerusalem, what kind of person did God seek? What was the result?
