Jesus Who Turned Water into Wine John 2:1-11

Today's passage is often called "The Wedding at Cana" or the "Sign of Jesus Turning Water into Wine." What is the central message of today's scripture? The key point is that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God (John 20:30-31).

Jesus: The Source of Transformation, Life, and Joy Though Jesus took on human form just like us, He is also the Son of God, which makes Him different from us. This passage tells us that Jesus, as God, has the power to bring about fundamental transformation. Jesus is the God who can radically change me, my life, my family, and our church (2 Corinthians 5:17). Not just any change, but a better, more profound transformation. Without Jesus, our lives lose vitality, strength, and joy. But Jesus can give us eternal life, everlasting joy, and satisfaction.

In today's passage, there are three significant human actions when Jesus turns water into wine.

First. Invitation.

In verse 2, someone invited Jesus to the wedding. If no one had invited Him, and He had not been present, no matter how much water was drawn, the guests would never have tasted the better wine.

It is essential for us to invite Jesus into our lives. Inviting Jesus means accepting Him as our Savior and Lord. We must trust Him and invite Him into our daily lives.

Second, Petition.

In today's passage, when the wine runs out, Jesus' mother immediately tells Him, "They have no more wine" and asks Him for help. She acknowledges the problem and seeks its solution. Even when it seems like a rejection, she tells the servants to do whatever Jesus says. How could she do this? Because she was confident. She believed that Jesus would answer her request. Dear friends, if you desire real change and the restoration of joy in your life, come before Jesus and ask. Jesus will transform your life and restore your joy.

Third, Obedience.

Jesus' mother believed in His ability to act. So what does she say? "Do whatever He tells you" (verse 5). And what do the servants do? They obey. When Jesus tells them to fill the jars with water, they do it. When He tells them to serve the water to the guests, they do it. This is obedience. If we believe that Jesus is the Son of God, we must obey His words. When we obey Jesus' words, we experience His power. God acts according to His Word, and when Jesus speaks, it happens just as He says.
