Summary

1 Samuel 22:1-2, 1 Chronicles 11:9-19

I. Introduction

God works through community.

God ruled Israel through the Adullam community that He gave to David.

Although the Adullam community started in a very humble state, it became an elite leadership group. Let us explore what kind of community God uses through the example of the Adullam community.

II. Main Body

The Adullam community was a community that served and obeyed God as their only Master.
 David always inquired of the Lord and obeyed Him whenever he made decisions.
 But Saul's community did not inquire of God; they acted according to human will.

Therefore David's community grew stronger, while Saul's community became weaker (2 Sam 3:1). Hanuri Community is a community that takes Jesus as Lord and follows Him alone.

2. The Adullam community was a community that praised and worshiped God alone.

In Psalm 34 we see the Adullam community worshiping the Lord.

Even while hiding in the cave, they praised and worshiped God (Psalm 57).

Hanuri Community must be a worship and praise community that gives glory to God alone.

3. The Adullam community was a training community that continually trained and discipled its members.

We can see this from the repeated word "leader" (sar) in the passage.

The term "mighty men" also shows that the Adullam community was a training community. David did not teach them only martial skills; he also provided spiritual instruction (Ps 34:11).

A church without training and discipleship declines and eventually becomes like a kindergarten or a shelter.

4. The Adullam community was a vision community that carried the dream of God's kingdom.

After David was anointed as king, he held the vision of becoming Israel's king.

The members of the Adullam community had a vision for the kingdom of God.

Joab did not possess this vision, and although he accomplished great feats, his name is not found in the Hall of Honor.

Hanuri Community is a gathering of people who hold the vision of the kingdom of God.

5. The Adullam community was a community that loved and served one another.

The story of love and service between David and Ittai the Gittite (2 Sam 15:17-22) The beautiful story of David and the Three Mighty Warriors (1 Chron 11:15-19) Hanuri Church must become a community that loves and serves one another.

6. The Adullam community was a community that equipped its members for success.

They came wounded, but were restored and healed, becoming workers of God. They came as failures and empty-handed, yet became elite leaders of the united kingdom of Israel.

III. Conclusion

A good community, like the Adullam community, is not born by itself—it is built. Let us work together to build the Hanuri Community into an Adullam-like community.
